2023 Val Williams Scholarship Winner

Congratulations to Sashini Perera



This year, the Val Williams Scholarship has been awarded to a PhD student from Macquarie University, Sashini Perera.

We are very grateful to the Selection Committee for analysing the application and particularly to Wendy Grimm for preparing a report.

Sashini's proposed research builds on an existing field experiment at the Australian Botanic Garden Mount Annan wherein 10 species were chosen that have widespread native distributions across the New South Wales region. For each species, two very different provenances were selected. The contrasting climates are local Western Sydney climate and a hotter, drier climate.

The research proposes to investigate the influence of climate provenance on survival and plant performance with a view to predicting the success of species if Western Sydney becomes hotter and drier.

The second aspect of the project investigates the effect of addition of bio-char (charcoal) to the soil with and without microbial inoculation, under drought conditions.

The funds from the scholarship will enable the addition of a complementary glasshouse experiment, enable foliar nutrient analyses for both the field and glasshouse experiments and soil nutrient analysis of the field experiment. These will enable better assessment of the efficacy of the soil amendments for plant performance.

Update on Flower Display Stand by Jan Marshall



Ku-ring-gai Wildflower Garden is becoming colourful again after the dull summer period, this is reflected in what we are able to put on the flower display each week. On April 26th Norah Palmer and I found 6 species of banksia, *Banksia robur* was looking particularly spectacular. We also found a few sprigs of *Acacia suaveolens* with the promise of more acacias to come as *Acacia longifolia* and *Acacia ulicifolia* were in bud.

Over the last few weeks *Leptospermum squarrosum* and *Crowea saligna* have provided a splash of colour but soon the Boronia and Eriostemon will be in bloom in all their glory.

We need some more volunteers to help with the display which takes about 3 hours to refresh each week, this includes tidying the stand, collecting fresh samples then identifying and labelling the flowers. It's a great way to learn how to identify species. As we work on a roster the commitment is about once a month.

Bushcare at KWG Sue Bowen



Our group has participated in Ku-ring-gai Council's bushcare group at the Ku-ring-gai Wildflower Garden for many, many years. We never run out of weeds to remove. For instance, we have just spent Wednesday 24th May removing plants, flower stalks and bulbils of *Furcraea foetida* (sometimes

called Mauritian hemp) from the perimeter of one of the ponds near Caley's Pavilion.

Thank you Wendy for pointing these particular plants out to us and for providing the photo of a flowering plant at the pond. Young clumps of this weed resemble a *Doryanthes excelsa* (Gymea lily) or *Crinum pedunculatum* (Swamp lily), but they have fleshy leaves and spines on the end of their leaves. We have

previously found this weed in Ku-ring-gai Wildflower Garden but it can also be found at other sites around Sydney Harbour. Keep an eye out for it in bushland when you are weeding or bushwalking.



Cattai National Park is located at the junction of the Hawkesbury River and Cattai Creek to the north of Windsor.


